


Figure i.1 LABOUR ISN'T WORKING, 1978, Conservative Party of Great Britain, CPA, POSTER 1978/9-01.




Figure i.2 'LIBDEMS + TORIES ARE WORKING', The Guardian, 15 December 2011, BCA.




Figure i.3 LABOUR STANDS FOR ALL WHO WORK, 1929, Labour Party, PHM.






Figure 1.3 TAX THE LOAFER - NOT THE LOAF, 1910, Budget League, PHM.




Figure 1.2 LABOUR AT THE GATE, 1903, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 1.3 After the war, 1904, Labour Party, Gallery Oldham, m002285a.




Figure 1.5 YOU LIKE THEM, 1900, W.B. Cowell, Gallery Oldham, m008144.




Figure 1.6 WILL IT BURST TOO?, c. 1906, The Free Trade Union, PHM




Figure 1.8 "FREE TRADE", 1909, National Union of Conservative and Constitutional Associations, Mundaneum.




Figure 1.10 THE SOCIALIST'S LITTLE GAME, 1909, National Union of Conservative and Constitutional Associations, Mundaneum




Figure 1.12 UNFAIR PREFERENCE, c. 1909, Periodical Publications Ltd, POSTER, CPA, 1909/10-09.




Figure 1.13 BRITISH WORKMEN CHOOSE FOR YOURSELF, c. 1906, Imperial Tariff Commission, PHM.




Figure 1.15 YOU WOULD HAVE IGNORE ME, 1910, National Union of Conservative and Constitutional Associations, Mundaneum




Figure 1.17 A CROWN OF COMFORT, 1910, Avenue Press, Mundaneum.




Figure 1.19 "THE LIBERALS GAVE ME BREAD YOU OFFER ME A STONE.", Budget League, PHM




Figure 1.20 VOTE FOR THE LABOUT PARTY THE HOPE OF THE WORKER, Labour Party, Wigan Leisure and Culture Trust




Figure 1.21 LABOUR CLEARS THE WAY, 1910, Labour Party of Great Britain, PHM




Figure 1.22 THE OSBORNE JUDGEMENT, 1910, Labour Party of Great Britain, Wigan Leisure and Culture Trust




Figure 1.23 CAN IT BE DONE?, Budget Protest League, CPA, Poster 1909/10-10.




Figure 1.24 *WHERE IS IT*?, 1910, National Union of Conservative and Constitutional Associations, Mundaneum.




Figure 1.25 THE GLUTTON!, 1910, The Budget League, PHM.




Figure 1.27 The Worker's Burden, 1909, Hudson and Son for the Budget League, PHM




Figure 1.29 THE POOR MAN'S BURDEN, 1909, Periodical Publications, CPA, POSTER- 1909/10-20b.




Figure 2.1 *SAFETY FIRST!*, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Association, CPA, POSTER 1929-09.




Figure 2.3 GREET THE DAWN, 1923, Labour Party of Great Britain, PHM, NMLH.1995.39.4.3.




Figure 2.4 'What do the Tea-leaves say?', 1929, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Associations, CPA, POSTER 1929-46.




Figure 2.6 MONEY BUYS MORE under FREE TRADE, 1929, Liberal Publications Department, Mundaneum.




Figure 2.8 Youth's destiny lies with you!, 1929, Liberal Publication Department, Mundaneum.




Figure 2.10 THE PENCIL IS MIGHTIER THAN THE SWORD, 1929, Labour Party of Great Britain, PHM.




Figure 2.15 THE NEW VOTER, 1929, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 2.16 MEN & WOMEN WORKERS. YOUR CHANCE AT LAST, 1929, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 2.17 The NEW ROAD, 1929, Liberal Publication Department, Mundaneum




Figure 2.18 WE CAN CONQUER UNEMPLOYMENT ROAD MAKING EMPLOYS 47 DIFFERENT TRADES, 1929, Liberal Publication Department, Mundaneum




Figure 2.19 NO MORE OF THIS, 1929, Liberal Publication Department, Mundaneum




Figure 2.22 *DON'T BE CAUGHT* National Union of Conservative and Unionist Associations, 1929. CPA, POSTER 1929-43.




Figure 2.25 TRUST BALDWIN He will steer you to safety!, CPA, POSTER 1929-32.




Figure 2.26 BALDWIN'S SECURITY MIXTURE, 1929, CPA, POSTER 1929-44.




Figure 2.27 WE MOBILISED for WAR – LET US MOBILISED for PROSPERITY, 1929, Liberal Publication Department, Mundaneum.




Figure 2.28 LABOUR'S LEADER MAKE HIM THE NATION'S LEADER




Figure 2.29 GENERAL MANAGER WANTED, 1929, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 2.30 WORDS WORDS WORDS, Labour Party, Mundaneum.




Figure 2.31 SOCIALIST SCHEMES MEAN £250,000,000 MORE A YEAR IN TAXES!. 1929, National Union of Conservative and United Association, CPA, POSTER 1929-41.




Figure 2.32 *THE CHEAPJACK*, 1929, National Union of Conservative and United Association, CPA, POSTER 1929-40.




Figure 2.33 *BEWARE OF THE SERPENT*, 1929, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Associations, CPA, POSTER 1929-26.




Figure 2.34 *SO PRETTY!- 'TILL THEY BURST'*, 1929, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Associations, CPA, POSTER 1929-28.




Figure 2.35 *VOTE CONSERVATIVE AND SAFEGUARD YOUR EARNINGS*, 1929, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Association CPA, POSTER 1929-39.





Figure 2.36 ANOTHER LEG-UP FROM THE LIBERALS!, National Union of Conservative and Unionist Association, CPA , POSTER 1929-39.




Figure 3.4 *CLEMENT DAVIES THE LIBERAL LEADER*, 1950, Liberal Publication Department, Hoover Institution: UK 2495.




Figure 3.5 *CLEMENT DAVIES The Liberal Leader*, 1951, Liberal Publication Department, Hoover Institution: UK 2494.




Figure 3.6 FRANK BYERS CHIEF LIBERAL WHIP, 1950, Liberal Publication Department, Hoover Institution: UK 2497.




Figure 3.7 *LORD SAMUEL LEADER of the LIBERAL PRESS*, 1950, Liberal Publication Department, Hoover Institution: UK 2498.




Figure 3.10 Poverty, Slums Dole Queues Low Wages, 1951, Labour party, People's History Museum.




Figure 3.11 After four years LABOUR, 1950, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, CPA: 1950-05.




Figure 3.12 WEIGHED AND FOUND WANTING, 1931, National Union Conservative and Unionist Associations, CPA: 1931-13.




Figure 3.13 KEEP IT GOING, 1950, Labour party, PHM.




Figure 3.14 It's common sense, 1950, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, CPA: POSTER 1995-07.




Figure 3.16 for family – happiness – and a home, 1950, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, CPA: 1950-09.




Figure 3.17 HEALTHY THANKS TO LABOUR, 1950, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 3.18 Family Allowances, 1950, Labour party of Great Britain, PHM.




Figure 3.19 *give him security and a proud future*, 1950/1951, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, CPA: POSTER 1951-22.




Figure 3.21 "The way things are going I shall be grown up before we get OUR HOUSE", 1951, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, CPA: POSTER 1951 06.




Figure 3.23 DADDY'S JEALOUS, 1950, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 3.24 Work for all, Labour party, 1950, PHM.




Figure 3.25 LABOUR FOR SECURITY, 1945, Labour party of Great Britain, PHM.




Figure 4.1 YESTERDAY'S MEN (They Failed Before!) Labour Party, 1970, PHM.




Figure 4.2 LIFE'S BETTER with the CONSERVATIVES, Conservative and Unionist Central Office, 1959, CPA.




Figure 4.4 Vote Bob Mellor, 1964, Peter Cunnigton, PHM.




Figure 4.5 Labour's got Life and Soul, 1970, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 4.6 WHEN IT COMES DOWN TO IT - AREN'T LABOURS IDEALS YOURS AS WELL, 1970, Labour Party of Great Britain, PHM.




Figure 4.7 THE ADMAN COMETH, Vicky, The Evening Standard, 21 May 1963, BCA.




Figure 4.8 Cookson, What's so damned amusing? Evening News, 10 February 1970.




Figure 4.9 Kiss Kiss, Penguin Books




Figure 4.14 Their health, their education, their opportunity – when it comes down to it aren't you voting for your children's future as well, Labour Party, PHM.




Figure 4.17 No rise in unemployment, 1970, Conservative Central Office, CPA.




Figure 4.22 For a better tomorrow vote Conservative, 1970, Conservative Central Office CPA.




Figure 5.1 NEW LABOUR NEW DANGER, 1997, Conservative Central Office, CPA, POSTER 1997-08.




Figure 5.2 FOOT PUMP, 1983, CPA: POSTER 1983-04




Figure 5.4 LABOUR. THE OPPOSITION PARTY, 1983, Conservative party, CPA: POSTER 1983-09




Figure 5.8 NEW LABOUR NEW TAXES, (1996), Conservative Central Office, CPA: POSTER 1997-06




Figure 5.12 Peter Brookes, *Nature Notes, The Times*, 15 Mar 1997, BCA: PC109.




Figure 5.14 ENOUGH IS ENOUGH, 1997, Labour Party, PHM




Figure 5.18 General Election 1997 Billboard Posters, 1997, PHM




Figure 6.2 The country's crying our for change. Vote Labour. 1987, Labour Party, PHM
